- DATE - February 12-14, 1982

- PURPOSE - Critically examine and assess state of Black Studies curriculum offerings in Culture and Social Analysis (Review includes courses on Africa, Afro-America, and Afro-Caribbean)
- METHOD - Collect course outlines in Culture and Social Analysis (Literature, Music, Drama, Art, Religion, Philosophy, Sociology, Anthropology, Psychology). Course outlines reviewed by authorities in each discipline; convene workshops/conferences in each discipline area to present and discuss Reviewers' evaluations, share information and ideas; engage in critical dialogue with Reviewers and Curriculum Specialist.
- GOALS - Publishing a Directory of Model Courses - following the workshops/conference and establishing a Black Studies Curriculum Materials Repository/Clearinghouse.

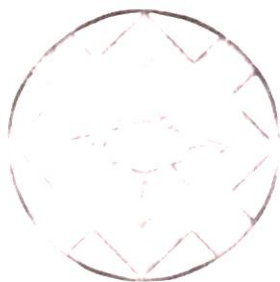
